Amador District 36 LAO Overview and Activities Report November 17, 2021 to December 8, 2021

D36 Mission Statement

District 36 is a volunteer-based non-profit organization of motorcyclists and like-minded enthusiasts who organize and enhance responsible family recreation and exercise environmental conservation for the purpose of promoting today's activities and protecting our sport for the future.

Dear Board of Directors,

PERMITTED EVENTS

OVERVIEW OF NEW NON-FEDERAL VENUES - With the addition of \$30 million dollars from the Tesla "repayment" legislation, the CA OHV Trust Fund's acquisition account is now close to \$200 million dollars. The LAO continues to ramp up efforts to site new event and riding areas on private or local government lands. Also in the post-Tesla era, the LAO is working/meeting with local, state, and federal agencies to find replacement sites for new SVRA(s) in Northern California. There are numerous potential sites - under D36 jurisdiction in the Sacto Valley and/or in the foothills on either side - where a hybrid park using the Onyx Ranch SVRA model (a mix of BLM, local, state, and private property) would have local government support.

Again, the LAO will continue its outreach to rural counties and private land owners with a focus on creating new venues (e.g. private ranches, mining or timber property, etc.) upon which to hold sanctioned D36 competition events. This focus on counties/private property does not take away from other efforts to work with public land agencies at existing riding areas or finding new riding areas.

BLM MOTHERLODE FIELD OFFICE - In December, the LAO is meeting with the BLM Motherlode Field Office and the CA BLM's State Office to review BLM matrix lands that might be available for OHV use either as a federal unit or a hybrid Onyx Ranch-style SVRA.

BLM REDDING FIELD OFFICE - The LAO met with the Redding Field Office to have them start an initial review of scattered BLM parcels in 5 Northern California counties that could be used as part of a new SVRA.

CALAVERAS COUNTY - The LAO continues to work with Brian Garrahan to secure a location in Calaveras County for D36 events. Said work with Brian will restart in January as the Calaveras County Planning Department needs about 6 months lead time for major events.



December 7, 2021 Shasta County Board of Supervisors

SHASTA COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS - The LAO attended the Shasta County Board of Supervisors regular meeting on December 7, 2021. Shasta County continues to be a strong supporter of OHV and the LAO thanked them for previous efforts to protect access during the Shasta Trinity National Forest's travel management process. Support from rural counties including their planning department and Sheriff's Office are critically important factors in securing new venues and keeping existing areas open.

MAKING THE OLD CARNEGIE FUNCTION AGAIN FOR EVENTS - The LAO and Jerry Fouts continue to work with Carnegie SVRA management on event-related issues such as once gain using the east end of the park for events, streamlining permit process, and restarting the Carnegie SVRA Stakeholder Collaborative.

POLICY AND PLANNING



CHALLENGE CORRUPT DATA AT OCEANO DUNES BATTLE - Over the last 10 years, the LAO has participated in the fight to highlight fatal flaws in the "science" used by the San Luis Obispo County Air Pollution Control District to force State Parks to spend almost \$ 22 million dollars of OHV Trust Fund monies to mitigate the "toxic dust" issue at Oceano Dunes State Vehicular Recreation Area. While there are no D36 events held at the SVRA, it is important for the LAO to challenge the use of poor or no data to close a SVRA. Even worse is that Parks failed to call the APCD out but rather it continued to spend trust fund monies and close large portions of the riding area based on what they knew was false data.

to question more than a decade of funding and programmatic decisions that have impacted State

Parks. Instead of recognizing the contribution of our work and joining with us (as we have invited them to do) in compiling the available information to advise Parks with due diligence, the

APCD's comments reflect defensiveness and avoidance of the facts.

BLUE OAK RANCH AT COW MOUNTAIN PLANNING TO START - The BLM will start the much anticipated planning process in early 2022 that will lead to the opening of the 1,300 acre Blue Oak Ranch. The Blue Oak Ranch acquisition will add a much needed high quality camping/staging area for OHVers who use the South Cow Mountain OHV area for casual trail use or permitted D36 competition events. POST CALDOR FIRE TRAIL RECOVERY - The LAO will be working with trail stewardship leads such as Bruce Hendrickson and PWORA to help with post fire recovery of several OHV areas impacted by the 2021 Caldor Fire on Eldorado National Forest.

YOLO COUNTY OHV PARK PHASE 2 UPDATE -. The Yolo County Parks Division continues the planning process to open a new county OHV park or parks. The two OHV park concepts include:

- The development of a 330-acre conceptual park somewhere in the foothills/mountainous areas of Yolo County that could provide a special event section that includes a MX track, MX practice, and kids track. It could also provide trail experiences.
- The Gateway OHV Access Park ("Gateway Park"), which includes the development site amenities at the Cache Creek Regional Park Lower Site off of Highway 16 and adjacent to Road 40, through the Berryessa Snow Mountain National Monument, to Knoxville Recreation Area in Lake County.

As a member of the Yolo Park steering committee, the LAO believes there is real opportunity to create a unique access to some great OHV experiences for both casual use and special events. Thanks to all D36ers who continue to be engaged in this process.

COMPETITION STICKER (SB 227) REMAINS A CLUSTER

Unfortunately, the LAO has learned from the OHV Division that their legal department to will not approve their proposed guidelines on implementation of our post-SB227 reality brought on by the chair of the Assembly Appropriations Committee killing the bill at its last hearing before going to a full vote of the legislature.

In the meantime, the lack of guidance has continues to create a giant cluster for 2022 model year competition bikes. Some dealers are trying to comply with the red sticker program sunsetting by just giving customers a MSO/bill of sale, while other dealers are submitting paperwork and getting titles/registration/red stickers for the 2022 model year motorcycles due to DMV's outdated computer system. As in previous years, some customers are just simply registering bikes in OR and other states with reciprocity. It is a mess.

The LAO and our LAO Sacto lobbyist, Terry McHale, are prepared to reintroduce the bill after they review the political landscape over the Holiday season.
