D36 Enduro Steward's Report

The 2023 Enduro season started with a bang, That Dam Enduro by the Redding Dirt Riders had great weather and a huge turnout. The overall was taken by Anson Maloney with JT Baker second and Andrew Souza third in front of a field of 15 AA entrants. Riders were treated to a variety of different test with one especially tight sand section, a challenging one for all skill levels. Thank you RDR and everyone is looking forward to next year.

Then the snow came for real. The first Wilseyville Sprint Enduro had to postpone until April 16 due to 3 feet of snow on the property in the staging area making parking impossible. The Sawmill/Crosscut previously had to postpone as the Middle Creek OHV announced a hard closure until June due to snow and trail clearing issues.


The Wild horse and Wild Pony enduros luckily had no issues with snow closures; the only question was if the California contingent could get over the mountains. The weather cooperated and everybody was treated to the scenic Sierras with 15 feet of snow on their trip. A little dusting of snow and cold temperatures on Saturday didn't seem to dampen anyone's spirits as the desert dirt was ideal. Sunday's Enduro had double the D36 entrants of last year's event. D36 riders JT Baker and Calum Campbell dual entered the MRANN money class and took home second and third place checks.

Looking forward to the three upcoming Sprint enduros remaining for the spring with the first ever Wilseyville Sprint in April, the first running of the Fools Gold in the Sprint format in May and the 49er Sprint Enduro moving to June to insure the snow melts in time. Bruce Hendrickson

If your looking for official District 36 information your first stop should be the District 36 Website, the official source for answers and information. Supplemental rules are specific to each discipline that are generated by each discipline Steward.

Looking for information on the ISDE program; our Sponsors; Contingency Programs (get paid to race); Right To Ride (our LAO Program); Joining D36; member resources; meeting information, such as dates and meeting minutes; D36 bylaws; Promoter information such as referee repot, protest forms, Chartering with D36 etc. The list goes on.

D36 was founded in 1955 and What a GREAT thing D36 has done, with Volunteers running this district for six and a half decades, as well as also being a RDO (Recognized District Organization by AMA for a long time.

We have much to be proud of during these years as a RESPECTED organization by industry, the AMA, our multitude of sponsors, our political allies and our members, past and present! And We all know that each and every D36'er who has stepped up over the decades to be part of the leadership that keeps this District trucking along for all these years deserves our gratitude, even for the smallest to the largest participation! Every day we learn, and try to implement ways to better the district.

And we would be remiss to not acknowledge the **1987 Board of Directors** for vision in starting the LAO program on 1-1-88. It too has a long, long history of benefit to our members, and is a respected & acknowledged program by State Parks, BLM, USFS, Counties, Legislative bodies and others for its efforts to keep the programs rolling as part of OHV protectionism in our state. It is now a 35 year old program within D36, and overall, a huge success that is supported by our membership all of these years.

Motion Pro has supported the LAO (Legislative Action Office) program since the beginning, as they started something called SOS, which was Save Our Sport. They put bulletin boards in dealerships about issues harming OHV recreation for regular folks to stay up to speed. FYI...... Many Gold & Platinum Sponsors we have had over the years started with D36 LAO 1st, supporting the LAO Bike Fundraiser, and giving a 10%

District 36 Membership Information Did you know?

- D36 memberships expire on the last day of the month/ year that is noted on the card, not the first day of that month. (Noted in the small print on the card or renewal notice.)
- Membership expiration dates don't get set by the exact day of the month you bought the membership. (See D36 rule 2.3)
- If you renew your membership timely, the expiration date extends one full year.
- If you wait longer than one month after the expiration date to renew, the expiration date will adjust according to rule 2.3.
- When a membership remains "expired" longer than one full year, there is no guarantee that the same membership number can be reassigned when it does get renewed. (See D36 rule 2.3)
- Membership numbers that have been in "expired" status longer than one year are subject to 'release' and they become available for new members, or for any member who has submitted a membership number change request.
- D36 Cross Country racing rule 7.6.10 specifies that all unranked A and AA class riders will use their D36 mem-



bership number as their bike (racing) number. It also specifies that all three number plates on the bike will display the rank number or the D36 membership number. (Please do not badger the scoring team to get them to program your transponder to any different number and please don't run other numbers on your plates.)

- D36 membership applications that are not signed with the valid/legal signature cannot be processed until the correct signature has been acquired. (Everyone 18+ years old must sign their own application. 18+ year olds are no longer eligible to be included on a family membership, even if they still live at home.)
- Receipts for memberships are only valid for 40 days.
 (D36 rule 2.8) If you do not receive your card within 30 days from the date you purchased the membership, please Email Cat (Membership Director)
- There is a lot of helpful membership related information on the D36 website – www.ama-d36.org. Go to the 'Resources' selection under the "Members" heading at the top of the home page. Also go to the 'Join' or 'Renew' selection and scroll down below the online application for additional information.




Want To Help Improve This Newsletter?

Our Club Spotlight is on



Nevada County Woods Riders

The second annual NCWR (Nevada County Woods Riders) Awards Banquet / Meeting was held in Nevada City, CA on February 1st this year. And this wasn't just another motorcycle club meeting.

Besides enjoying the trails and back roads of Nevada, Placer and El Dorado Counties and the surrounding Sierra mountain forests and the vast Nevada deserts, the NCWR is very involved in promoting responsible trail use, advocates off-road vehicle OHV access rights and fosters trail improvement programs with the Tahoe National Forest Service. They are a charter member of the AMA (American Motorcycle Association) and District 36 (The AMA's regional motorcycle competition arm).

The club works very closely with the National Forest Service in that the club helps maintain existing trails by clearing overgrowth and fallen trees, they help in laying out and the clearing of new trails. (That's right new trails) They also work with the Equestrian clubs in helping clear fallen trees on the trails that run through the existing OHV trails in Nevada County. By helping the Equestrians we also help the bicycle riders who also use the Equestrian trails. Yes it's a very delicate balance and can be very challenging but it's worth the effort. The club also works very closely with the Sierra Buttes Trail Stewardship which is a Non Profit Organization that builds and maintains hundreds of miles of trails in the Sierra's. They are also working on a project called Connected Communities (through trails) There are a lot of small communities in the Sierra's that suffered greatly when logging in those communities all but disappeared. This project will connect fifteen of these communities by creating multi use single track trails to and through each of them, when this project is complete it will add an additional six hundred miles of trails in the Sierra's. And this project is not a dream it is in fact very much underway.

The club easily donates 1000 plus hours per year to the Forest Service and many additional hours to the Sierra Buttes Trail Stewardship. The special part of the clubs volunteer work is The Forest Service and the Sierra Buttes Trail Stewardship receive funds from the Government based on an hourly rate for the volunteer hours, a huge win for everyone.

A brief history of the club, back in the late seventies there were a lot of trail riders from Nevada and surrounding Counties who also rode Dist 36 Enduro's, one of those riders Pete wanted to put a club affiliation name on the entry form, so He started putting down Western Nevada County Dirt Riders (WNCDR) eventually others started doing the same until one of the riders Doug thought the name was too long and they changed it Nevada County Woods Riders (NCWR) Doug also had some T shirts made with the new Nevada County map as a logo and the new name and a club was born. Eventually the club became more organized and at first the club was basically an Enduro riders only club, but as the years went on and more riders joined it became more like it is today, primarily focused on trail riding and maintenance but Dual Sport and Adventure bike rides are also part of what the club does.

As the club has become better known for what it does the membership has also grown and today has over two hundred fifty members. It's very gratifying to know the vast majority of the members are members because they want to give back, help and be part of something where what they do matters, is very rewarding and positive.

The club has been drawing increased attention from other clubs and organizations from a regional to the national level, because of its success in working hand in hand with the US Forest Service and other local groups and organizations that have a shared interest in what happens in the forest. There are few if any other clubs who have this kind of success and commitment and other clubs and organizations want to know how the club does it, well one thing is certain it has taken years of hard work, flexibility and continued commitment is a key.



This meeting drew some 200 members and family plus key note speakers from the Deputy Director of the CA state OHV (CA State off Highway Program) who brought us up to date on what's going on in the OHV world. And one of the big surprises of the evening was the NCWR (Nevada County Woods Riders) a nonprofit club presented to the Sierra Buttes Trail Stewardship also a nonprofit org. a check for \$5000 to help in their continued efforts to create trail systems in the Sierra's.

District 36's Riding and Racing programs are operated by volunteers. (We do not have a business office with staff.) We do our best to answer all email communications and return telephone messages as promptly as possible, but sometimes it can take a few days for us to get back to you, especially on weekends having meets. Please note: For those of you who use Gmail – if you email those of us who use a different email service, our replies to you may be getting routed to your junk/spam folders. Please check there if you are waiting to hear back from any of us.

Membership Card Questions and Answers



District 36 Membership cards often cause a bit of confusion to new members . . . and often to those who have been a D36 member for a number of years, too!

The card size was created to be close to the size of a credit card - something that can easily fit into a wallet. With this size, we are limited to the amount of information that can be printed on the front sides of the cards.

When applications are processed, the cards are created in accordance to AMA and D36 rules.

Below are some explanations that might help answer some questions about your membership card.

- A. <u>Membership Type.</u> Only three membership types can be on a blue D36 membership card. The 'Sportsman' designation is for all members age 12 and older, "Mini Bike Rider" is for those ages 7/8-11 and Pee-Wee is for those up to age 7/8. (Veteran, Senior, Super Senior, Master, Pioneer, Woman, AA, Open, 200, 250, Vintage, Modified, Big Wheel, Clutchless, etc. are only racing classes they are not a membership type.)
- B. <u>Racing Classification</u>. The racing class shown on all membership cards is what one's Sportsman (adult) classification is/would be. This is set by D36's rules and by the Discipline Stewards.
- C. <u>Birth Date.</u> A full birth date must be given on the application. If a full birth date is not provided, either 1/1/2050 will appear on the card or, in the case that just an age (38 for example) was provided, then a guestimated month/date will be listed with the corresponding year to indicate the age of 38.
- D. <u>The Expiration Date.</u> A D36 membership expires on the last day of the month/year listed on the card. D36 memberships are valid one year from the <u>month</u> of purchase. (Example: If someone buys their first membership in the month of June, the expiration date will be the last day of the following May.)
- E. <u>District 36 Membership Number.</u> New members will be assigned the next available number when their application is processed. A membership number/letter cannot be assigned prior to an application being received and processed. All youth and all C class adults receive three numbers, plus letter, as their membership number. Membership numbers cannot begin with a zero. When a membership has remained expired for longer than one year, that membership number may be 'released' and then get reassigned to someone else. There is no guarantee that the same number will be reassigned to someone who renews an inactive membership that was expired for longer than one year.

Where Is My Membership Card?

From the date you apply for or renew your D36 membership, if your card does not get back to you by the 30 day mark, please contact d36memberships@gmail.com.

Always read all of the instructions and fill out the application completely, so that your application can get processed timely. Always save your receipt. Always allow enough mailing/processing time to get the card back before you need it.

If Applications are: too sloppy to read; missing a full mailing address; missing your contact phone number and email address; missing the correct signature; or, if they have not yet been given to D36 from the clubs there may be a delay in receiving your membership card.

Have A Rule You Think Needs To Be Added Or Changed?

The District 36 Operations Manual is a rulebook covering District 36 Procedures and Competition. Procedural rules are decided on by the District 36 Board of Directors and rules governing Competition are decided on by the District 36 Active Members (Clubs and Promoters).

Do you, as a current member of District 36, have a rule proposal you want to get submitted? If so you will need to fill out a Rule Proposal Form and submit it to the appropriate steward.....CC rules to the CC Steward, Jeremy Carlin, Enduro Rules to the Enduro Steward, Bruce Hendrickson, and Dirt Track Rules to the Dirt Track Steward, Carter Fisher. If your proposal is not discipline specific or applies to all disciplines you will submit your proposal to the Rules Chairman, Bill McGibbon and the Director of Competition, Jeff Irwin.

We have rules for Rule Proposals and it's recommended

that if you're submitting a proposal you review the current District 36 Operations Manual, section 1.6 Rulebook

The Rule Proposal form is editable (Download it first then you can fill it out on your computer and "save as") or print them and fill them out by hand. To submit your proposal:

- Submitter must be a current District 36 Member.
- Fill out a Rule Proposal / Change Form completely.
- Submit the proposal by one of the following:
 - Send the proposal electronically to the appropriate person. You will find a list of steward contacts on our District 36 Contact Page.
 - ♦ Hand it to a Steward at a meet.
 - Hand it in at a monthly D36 Meeting
 - Mail it to District 36 (see contact page)
 - * Rule Submission Deadline—Oct 15
