There was exciting racing at all events averaging more than 10 AA riders per event. The last event of the Spring had an exciting showdown of two factory KTM riders, taylor Robert and Mateo Oliveria, members of this year's ISDE trophy teams. The margin between them was 7 seconds after 60 miles of back and forth in the tests.

As we go into to the summer break JT Baker leads the A overall championship, Myles Henderson the B overall and Clay McDonnell the C overall. Lots of competition in all the classes with a large competitive Woman's C class among the class championships.

Our 2023 season is under way!

The new transponder scoring system is up and running - thanks to LMC for their hard work and investment to get this going for the racers, including all of us non-techoriented folks!

Also new this year, LMC has added the option of online pre-entries for their events. Save yourself some time at sign-ups and save some money on the race entry fee by signing up before race day.



Congratulations to the DT'ers who have moved up to the next higher racing class, so far, this season.

There are more racers who are within just a few points of earning their advancements, too. Once notified of an advancement, you will need to enter the new class at your next event. The C & B sportsman advancement point lists can be found on the D36 website at: <a href="http://results.ama-d36.org/2023/DT/">http://results.ama-d36.org/2023/DT/</a>

Racers, please remember that you are responsible for signing up and racing in the correct class. If you have any questions or issues, contact me. (You won't receive series or advancement points if you race in the wrong class.)

Also, please remember - it is your responsibility to make sure that your D36/AMA membership cards are current when you race. You need to have them with you at sign-ups. [Take a clear photo that displays everything clearly on your cards to use as a temporary back-up, if you forget the cards on race day.]

It is not the duty of sign-up crews to find out for you if your membership is current, just because you didn't bring your cards or valid receipt with you to sign-ups. (Receipts dated 40 days or less are valid, those longer than 40 days are no longer valid.) You must let the D36 Membership Director know if you haven't received your D36 card within 30 days of buying or renewing a membership. (You won't receive series or advancement points if you race without a current membership or one meet pass.)

Please help the sign-up crews by being fully prepared when you get in line – don't wait until you get up to the counter to start filling out your forms. Have all of your race entry forms, minor release forms (parents are required at sign-ups), etc. completely filled out and signed, so the lines can move quickly and racing can start on time. Don't skip the rider's meetings or skip checking the posted schedules before the practices, heats and mains – it isn't anyone's job to hunt you down to make sure you get to the start line on time.

The D36 series class standings and advancement points are updated after we've received the race results and there are no pending protests – we get them posted on the D36 website as promptly as possible.

Now, let's get back to the fun stuff – Racing!! Have a happy summer – see you at the track! ♦



# BLM Proposed Policy To Close BLM Land To OHV And Others

"Hard-core environmentalist at the BLM Washington Office have proposed the most extreme land policy change that I have seen in my 33 years of OHV advocacy. This plan targets OHV, grazing, mining, energy and commercial recreation for elimination across all BLM lands including our riding areas.," says Don Amador, AMA-District 36 LAO Director

Conservation is a key element of land management today that protects natural resources and also provides sustainable recreation for OHV and other activities that families enjoy. Traditional Conservation includes maintaining trails to reduce soil loss, restoration, and post-fire recovery. However, under this rule proposal Conservation efforts would be restricted to "protection" and "restoration."

The proposed rule would direct BLM staff to identify and mitigate "disturbances" and restore the land to its natural state. Authorized officers would be required to avoid authorizing any use of the public lands that permanently impairs ecosystem resilience. Staff would also be directed to review and mitigate OHV and other recreation uses at designated intensive use areas such as the BLM Fort Sage OHV Area in California and the BLM Knolls OHV Area in Utah.

The new mitigation hierarchy would be to avoid, minimize, and compensate for impacts to all public land resources.

The new concept of private sector managed Conservation leases on BLM lands is also troubling for OHV access since the strict prohibition of OHV activity is a core tenet of most, if not all, private, state, and federal conservation lease plans and programs.

Many recreation and other multiple-use interests objected to the BLM's 2017 2.0 Planning Rule because it created a vague set of hard to follow or implement standards that would have resulted in confusion, chaos and a loss of OHV access for casual use and permitted events such as amateur competition and club rides. For those and other reasons, Congress and the President repealed the rule.

If this new rule is enacted it will also create confusion and chaos. Agency staff will no longer have time to authorize permitted OHV events or do travel plans. Designated OHV sites would most likely see a loss of opportunity including entire areas being closed due to new definitions.

I believe the agency should redraw this proposal that appears to have been crafted behind closed doors with little if any substantive input from diverse multi-use stakeholders. The public, partners, and agency staff that we work with deserve better.

### OPPOSITION TO BLM CONSERVATION RULE GROWS

I first want to thank all the growing number of OHV and other outdoor recreation enthusiasts, organizations, clubs, and businesses who have answered the call to send comment letters and alert their rider networks to the BLM regarding their Proposed Conservation and Landscape Health Rule (PR).

<u>l also want you to know that OHV recreation and other multiple-use interests are not fighting this battle alone</u>. Besides a number of OHV recreation and powersports associations submitting substantive comments urging the BLM to withdraw this ill-advised, counter-productive, most likely illegal, and highly divisive PR, we have support from the U.S. Small Business Administration and Governors from six western states that are challenging the plan. ◆

## Cost Recovery May Be Coming Back. Could this be an End To Permitted Events In The National Forest?

The Forest Service has proposed to amend its special use regulations to update the processing and monitoring fee schedules based on current Agency costs; to provide for recovery of costs associated with processing special use proposals, as well as applications; and to remove the exemption for commercial recreation special use applications and authorizations that involve 50 hours or less to process or monitor.

OWR believes the proposed rule amendments with their collective weight will disenfranchise important partners by creating a significant fiscal hardship on the motorcycle clubs, riders, and families that use FS lands. Many clubs, are 501 (c) 7 volunteer-based social clubs or have some other non-profit classification. QWR believes the loss of the 50-hour exemption and other proposed, yet vague, fee increases will force many partner clubs to cease applying for a special use permit since events such as an amateur Enduro are many times a "break-even" proposition since the entry fees will not cover the club's expense for items such as on-site medical services, communications, and other event materials. This proposal threatens those important partnerships and the pre-event volunteer trail work they do.

In 2011, I was part of a national effort that called for reform of the permitting process because it had become so complicated and costly that most "non-profit club events" could simply not comply with the requirements. In addition, historic and popular competitive events occurring without problems had been subjected to arbitrary fees where permit fees were raised from \$500 to \$10,000 -\$20,000 or more. In some areas, the application process to obtain a special use permit was used to prohibit and/or severely restrict otherwise allowable activities.

QWR is urging our motorized and non-motorized recreation group partners to review the proposal and urge the agency to amend the proposal to address concerns you may have. The comment period ends on June 20, 2023. Thanks for your review of this important topic.

Editors note: While the comment period has passed we still believe that all should be informed of the above. It's the government continuing to add more burden to clubs and promoters. It wouldn't hurt to write your congressperson. It's long overdue for the motorcycle community to stand up and be heard! If you don't, then never ask, "Wait, why is the gate locked to my riding area?"



### Not So Long Ago......



itting on the starting line of the Polka Dots' Prairie City Grand Prix in Rancho Cordova, California, brothers Brian and Patrick Garrahan decided that the best way to win this race couldn't be accomplished by leading the first lap. The "Rock Pile," as some affectionately call Prairie City SRVA, is notorious for reaching out and biting. After 10 consecutive days of heavy rains and wind, the first turn looked more like a Jet Ski course than a cross-country like a Jet Ski course than a cross-country course. Racers lined up in a Le Mans-style starting position, and when the starter's shotgun blasted, the brothers walked to their bikes, looked over at each other, and then rode wheelies down the straight – last off their row! As it turned out, that was actly what it took to win, as they finished the event first and second overall.

The holeshot was garnered by Jordan Brandt, on a borrowed BMW with 8,000 miles on it. (The new BMW race bikes are not yet available for sale in California.) Brandt and his Dick's Racing/A&S BMW held the lead until the VORA Truck Track section, where Rodney Spencer used his flat-track riding skills to motor by. Spencer and fellow flat-track ace Mike Rush thought nothing of the super-wet and slippery conditions, and they took over the first and second spots. Unfortunately, the course had other plans for Spencer, as he lost his front wheel on a basketball-sized rock and got stuck under his bike for a bit.
Rush's day ended not much later: After
coming through the first lap's home check
in third, his head pipe cracked and soon it

was DNF time.

Brandt's day was looking good when he was running second, but then a course-marking stick torpedoed his clutch pivot and made the clutch slip. Brandt found a track worker, and they used a claw hammer to make the needed repairs, but he never got back in the hunt – opting to instead use the test of the day to researce for his assault on. rest of the day to prepare for his assault on the National Enduro Series.

Brian Garrahan must not have gotten the message to take it easy on the first lap, as he came through the home check in the lead – a lead he kept until the finish. His brother Pat stuck to the plan and eted the first lap in 11th place.

completed the first lap in 11th place.
Pat's methodical march toward the front brought him right to the rear fender of his little brother Brian. Unfortunately, Brian's Yamaha was kicking up too much mud, and Pat had to back away, opting to save his now-goggleless eyes. Brian's take

guy." Brothers? Obviously. Spencer held on for third overall. Justin Bonita proved that his last win was no fluke, coming in just seconds later in fourth. Brian Sperle, Kris Howes, Jonathan Davis, Mark Kerling, Steven Godman and Nick Thompson, who ran up front for most of the race, rounded out the top 10.

Brian Toline topped the Vet class. Kane Silverberg finished seven seconds behind Mike Sage in the Senior class. Perhaps the best ride of the day was put in by B Overall winner Billy Hilton Jr., who overall and first B rider in what had to be overall and first B rider in what had to be the wettest and sloppiest race in recent memory. One could only feel sorry for the Polka Dots club members and their volunteers, who had to stay out in the rain long after the race, cleaning up. With round one of this 14-race series in the books, one can only hope the stormy weather will back off a little.

The first day of the weekend-long event was a different story, as Saturday's D36/Motion Pro Youth Cross Country Series racers enjoyed mostly sunny skies and wet dirt. Their course ran much the same as the big-bike course, without the same as the big-onke course, without the dreaded Rock Pile. D36's future stars of off-road shredded the near-perfect dirt. In the Youth AA race, Max Grogan-Crane led the first lap, only to have Jakob McCoid take the lead on lap two and then hold on for a convincing win. Tucker Larrieu clobbered the B class after a bad start, finishing the race in third overall and first B rider.

Round two, the Oasis Hare Scrambles, has been rescheduled for February 6-7, because of heavy rains. Round three will be the Picacho Creek National Hare Scrambles, February 13-14; this is also round one of 2010's AMA Racing West Hare Scrambles Championship Series. CN


### District 36 Membership Information Did you know?


- D36 memberships expire on the last day of the month/ year that is noted on the card, not the first day of that month. (Noted in the small print on the card or renewal notice.)
- Membership expiration dates don't get set by the exact day of the month you bought the membership. (See D36 rule 2.3)
- If you renew your membership timely, the expiration date extends one full year.
- If you wait longer than one month after the expiration date to renew, the expiration date will adjust according to rule 2.3.
- When a membership remains "expired" longer than one full year, there is no guarantee that the same membership number can be reassigned when it does get renewed. (See D36 rule 2.3)
- Membership numbers that have been in "expired" status longer than one year are subject to 'release' and they become available for new members, or for any member who has submitted a membership number change request.
- D36 Cross Country racing rule 7.6.10 specifies that all unranked A and AA class riders will use their D36 mem-



bership number as their bike (racing) number. It also specifies that all three number plates on the bike will display the rank number or the D36 membership number. (Please do not badger the scoring team to get them to program your transponder to any different number and please don't run other numbers on your plates.)

- D36 membership applications that are not signed with the valid/legal signature cannot be processed until the correct signature has been acquired. (Everyone 18+ years old must sign their own application. 18+ year olds are no longer eligible to be included on a family membership, even if they still live at home.)
- Receipts for memberships are only valid for 40 days.
   (D36 rule 2.8) If you do not receive your card within 30 days from the date you purchased the membership, please <a href="Email Cat"><u>Email Cat</u></a> (Membership Director)

Also go to the 'Join' or 'Renew' selection and scroll down below the online application for additional information.







#### **Have A Rule You Think Needs To Be Added Or Changed?**

The District 36 Operations Manual is a rulebook covering District 36 Procedures and Competition. Procedural rules are decided on by the District 36 Board of Directors and rules governing Competition are decided on by the District 36 Active Members (Clubs and Promoters).

Do you, as a current member of District 36, have a rule proposal you want to get submitted? If so you will need to fill out a Rule Proposal Form and submit it to the appropriate steward.....CC rules to the CC Steward, Jeremy Carlin, Enduro Rules to the Enduro Steward, Bruce Hendrickson, and Dirt Track Rules to the Dirt Track Steward, Carter Fisher. If your proposal is not discipline specific or applies to all disciplines you will submit your proposal to the Rules Chairman, Bill McGibbon and the Director of Competition, Jeff Irwin.

We have rules for Rule Proposals and it's recommended

that if you're submitting a proposal you review the current <u>District 36 Operations Manual</u>, section 1.6 Rulebook

The Rule Proposal form is editable (Download it first then you can fill it out on your computer and "save as") or print them and fill them out by hand. To submit your proposal:

- Submitter must be a current District 36 Member.
- Fill out a Rule Proposal / Change Form completely.
- Submit the proposal by one of the following:
  - ♦ Send the proposal electronically to the appropriate person. You will find a list of steward contacts on our **District 36 Contact Page**.
  - ♦ Hand it to a Steward at a meet.
  - Hand it in at a monthly D36 Meeting
  - ♦ Mail it to District 36 (see contact page)
  - \* Rule Submission Deadline—Oct 15
