## HAPPY NEW YEAR

### YAMAHA FUNDS DISTRICT 36 MEMBERS

The next time you buy a new bike consider the contribution Yamaha is making to our trails! Yamaha, in partnership with Friends of Cow Mountain, is working to make trails safer and more enjoyable to ride.



Friends of Cow Mountain, a non-profit that does trail work on Cow Mountain, is run by five District 36 members. We do trail maintenance, build new sections of trail, and do brushing and trail clearing projects. The fire on Cow Mountain of 2018 led to many dangerous “dagger like” burned limbs projecting into the trails and a huge bumper crop of fresh brush that is beginning to completely cover some trails. We are currently using our excavator to clear brush off of trail #24 to make a safer and more pleasurable riding experience.



Yamaha Corporation, through their Outdoor Access Initiative, has a competitive grant process that provides funding for organizations to improve trail systems and provide for safety and access. The OAI recently surpassed a remarkable \$6 million in cumulative funding to different trail projects across the country. Friends of Cow Mountain is using funds provided by Yamaha OAI to help pay for the work we are doing on trail #24.

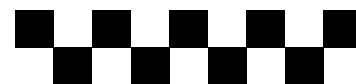

## Recap of Season's Closing Weekend for Dirt Track

Thoughts on Monday morning (11-13-23), after the two-day Fast Times Promotions Hills Ferry Raceway weekend.

First, it was an awesome event. So many families showed up with their RV's, trailers, trucks, and riders. Saturday night the pits were filled with overnight campers anticipating the final 2023 Fast Times Promotions/D36 DT series races on Sunday. There were over 100 riders each day to enjoy the competition on a well-groomed, fast, competitive racetrack.

Michael Inderbitzin cleaned up all weekend, winning the Framer Shootout, the Fast Times Money and Open A races by a country mile both days. Tony Meiring and Branden Weller rounded out the 100% payback, Open A podium both days. Jonathan Schaefer, sponsored by Mike Hardy Racing, topped the District 36 Vintage A championship, finishing first in that class on Sunday and third Saturday.

Ten riders lined up for the Saturday night Framer Shoot Out. Motion Pro, Works Connection, K/E Motorsports and Hardy racing all sponsored the class with some fabulous gifts. Bryan Berna and Michael Rodrigues rounded out the podium finishing second and third behind Inderbitzin. Branden Weller finished second in the Fast Times Money class both Saturday and Sunday.

Fifteen riders lined up for the Master A class. Matt Gomez sampled some dirt in the first lap, and topped the podium after fierce competition with Rick Shafer. The race was wheel to wheel competition, corner to corner, beginning to end. Other riders earning a mention were Dan Cahoon and Bryan Berna. Cahoon took three first place wins over the weekend while Berna took one win in the Vintage 50+ A class & struggled with his bike all day Sunday. However, he & his buddy produced an outstanding Bar BQ Saturday night & breakfast burritos Sunday. He got first in that class!!

Running of the Bulls on Sunday was an amazing race to watch. Twelve riders lined up, the competition was fast and furious. Branden Weller, aboard a Nielsen built Bultaco, got the hole shot and never looked back. Jonathan Schaefer (The Candy Man), sponsored for by Steffan Nielsen Racing, battled to finish second in front of Michael Rodrigues, sponsored by Mike Hardy. What a sight it was to see these beautiful vintage bikes compete. When Schaefer, as a youngster, started racing a few years ago, he would walk the pits selling candy

bars to help support his program. This year he took both the D36 and Fast Times Promotions Vintage A and the Running of the Bulls 2023 Championships.

In the kids classes there are some upcoming fast youngsters. Eloise Hedrick and Zoie Thoma topped their 50cc classes over the weekend. Oliver Cox won both the 65 and 85 classes on Sunday and the 100 Stock/Modified class both days.

The Fast Times Promotions team, Steffan Nielsen and Mike Fowler, with help from several sponsors including Mike Hardy Racing, Rod Lake Racing, Modesto Honda/KTM and others, as well as several people at each race acting as flaggers, scorers and other general assistants are proud of completing their first D36 series in 2023. They are working on the schedule for upcoming events in 2024.

The first Running of the Bulls event will take place at the Santa Rosa Indoor promoted by Brock McAllister in February, 2024. No series can survive without the participation and support of the riders and their families, the sponsors, and the help. They are so very appreciative of all the support they received in 2023 and look forward to another season of D36 racing in 2024.

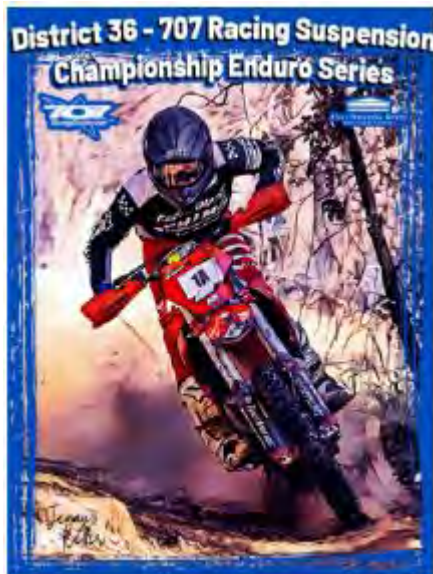

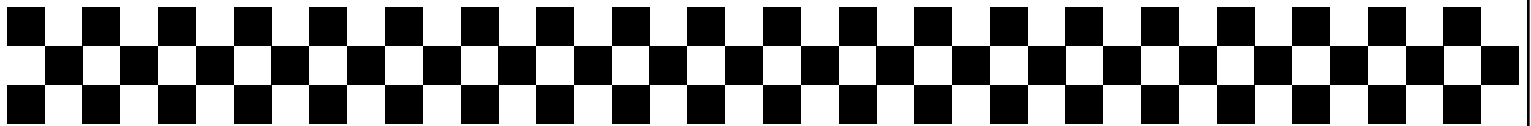

# Rule Changes for 2024

Ride Smart



1.2.1 Active Members (Club Officers, Promoters and Referees) and Competition Committeemen living within a 150-mile radius of the meeting place shall attend at least four (4) meetings per calendar year, one of which shall be the "Annual Meeting".

Those living over a 150-mile radius of the meeting place shall attend at least two (2) meetings per calendar year, one of which shall be the "Annual Meeting". Online meetings, shall attend at least four (4) meetings per calendar year, one of which shall be in person at the "Annual Meeting". Additional participation in other events may also be mandatory. (Rev 1 Dec 2023)

1.3 Meetings of the District 36 Motorcycle Sports Committee including Referees, delegates, and Competition Committeemen, shall be held on the third (3rd) Wednesday of each month at 7:00 p.m. An annual Sanctioning Meeting (the "Annual Meeting") in September shall be held for the purpose of awarding sanction dates for the upcoming year. Attendance at this meeting is mandatory for all District 36 Chartered Clubs and /or Promoters wanting sanctions for the upcoming year. (Rev 1 Dec 2023)

1.6.0 Procedures in this book are set by the Board of Directors and are not open to amendment by the Competition Committee. Requests for procedural rule changes shall be submitted to a member of the current Board of Directors. The rule proposal will be reviewed and voted upon by the Board of Directors. Individual discipline supplemental rules shall be approved by the Board of Directors.

1.6.1 Rules Committee meetings may be held in June and October and/or other times as deemed necessary by the Rules Committee Chairman. The Rules Committee may consist of Stewards, D36 officials and concerned D-36 Members. Rule change submissions are submitted to the appropriate Steward; or Rules Chairman if not specific to a discipline. If submitted to the Steward, he/she shall then submit the rule change to the Rules Chairman and the Director of Competition with his/her recommendation. Prior to a final vote by the Active Members taking place, all proposed rule changes are to be published in either the D-36 meeting minutes or posted on a separate page on the D36 website a minimum of 2 weeks prior to the next scheduled meeting. The Rules Committee may review all submitted rules and make a pass or don't pass recommendation to the Active Members. A rule change passes if approved by a majority of the voting members of the Active Members in attendance at the next scheduled meeting. If a rule change passes it will become effective the next race season. (Rev 1 Dec 2023)

1.6.2 The deadline for submitting rule changes/proposals for the following year's Operation Manual is September 15th of the current year. During the current year, at any time, a rule change/proposal that is deemed an "Emergency" rule proposal by the Rules Chairman or Director of Competition will be submitted to and voted on by the District 36 Board of Directors as soon as reasonably possible and if passed will take effect immediately. (Rev Dec 2023)

4.3.1 Junior Sportsman is any C Sportsman rider with zero advancement points, between the ages of 12 and 17. Engine size between 98-250cc, and minimum rear wheel size of 16". This class is exhibition only. (No championship or advancement points)

4.4.1 The C Women's class at any District 36 Enduro shall be scored for the same total milage as the majority of C Sportsman classes.

#### 4.4.3 Beginner Women's Class Definition / Requirements:

C Women riders with zero advancement points between the ages of 12 and 24 years of age. Engine size between 98-250cc ages 12-13 and Engine size 98-Open cc ages 14-24, minimum rear wheel size 16". This class is exhibition only. (No championship or advancement points)

7.5.3 Any District 36 "A" (including "AA"), B or C rider who works one District 36 championship point paying Enduro will receive District 36 championship points for the worked meet. The amount of points awarded shall be determined by the rider receiving the equivalent of 4th overall points or the average of his/her best 5 rides if there are 8 or more series events. If there are less than 8 series events, the amount of points awarded shall be determined by the rider receiving the equivalent of 4th overall points or average of his/her best 4 rides. District 36 membership MUST be current at the time of the meet worked.

## GENE ROGERS CHAMP IN 225 NATIONAL ENDURO

**T**HE HAYWARD Motorcycle Club of Hayward, Calif. sponsored the 1961 225-mile national championship enduro in the same territory as their previously held annual "Cowbell" enduros, Mendicino National Forest, which still contains some of the most primitive country left in northern California, practically extending up to the Oregon border. Start-finish would be at Upper Lake, Calif. about 30 or so miles from east of Ukiah, Calif. on highway 101 up from San Francisco. This is ideal enduro country and has proven to be popular with the riders.

Our "enduro trail committee" consisting of Garve and John Nelson, Bob Wagner, Art Collier-Dart, Cliff Peters and other members who had the time, between other club activities, work and what have you, made frequent trips up to the "stompin" grounds to add new trails, re-route others, check mileage, designate check points and all the other countless chores that go into making a good run. It was decided to hold the cowbell in November which is the best seasonal time favoring enduros, but such was not true, to some extent, this year as the weather had been terribly dry for the whole year in northern California. The run was still to prove a challenge to the riders, after the advertisements were out and the drawing was held, who, some 90-odd strong showed up to meet it head-on.

The first two riders to be picked were David Bentley, a "B" rider, and Arlan "Mickey" Shannon, an "A" rider, from San Jose, Calif. All types and sizes of machinery were to be represented that early Sunday morning, November 5th, which was eagerly awaited by all! It proved to be a cold morning with the stars shining icily as the buzz of activity stirred around the Upper Lake that a.m. (4-5 to be more precise). Post entries were applying as fast as the girls could take care of them, and our men as well as the Oakland, Calif. MC who volunteered to help us were taking off for their check points after having had a big breakfast at the Willows Cafe which has fed three years of enduro riders and workers for the cowbell events. Many had left early, Friday and Saturday, for the inland checkpoints and all signs and markings were laid out at that time. By 7:00 a.m. the riders had prepared

themselves, their machines and were now lined up waiting for the starting signal from referee Lloyd Shadbold of the Hayward MC.

The signal given, the first two riders are off, followed every minute thereafter by two more, the last two left at 8:19 a.m. They faced nine check-points with a noon checkpoint located at Elk Creek, Calif., inland about 114-miles. The "regular" course to check one consisted of a real "peach" of a hill and so an alternate course was mapped out for those preferring to warm-up gradually. Many tried the regular course and finally used the alternate (which penalized some points) course. 48 machines made the "regular" with 110 machines taking the alternate to the check. Many machines were non-starts, either not starting or developing trouble before check one. By checks two and three, riders were beginning to lose time consistently, so that by the noon check many were disqualified for being later than the limits.

There was an hour layover at the noon checkpoint, which many of the men took advantage of to check their machines, eat, gas up and catch a few winks. There were the usual groups comparing notes and talking shop, but they were primed for the afternoon takeoff back to the finish line and home. Of the 158 riders starting, only 79 started from the noon check. Others dropped out before or quit at the noon check for various reasons. Most riders were late on their time, but a few had comparably good time on leaving, but some time could be made up to checkpoint five which had a good stretch of dirt road.

Things began to pick up through the last checks as more hills, rough rocky creekbeds plus good dirt trails became encountered. Some men took wrong turns and one enduro (Al Gregerson, Oakland MC) rider took the wrong turn and got so lost that it took fellow members till the next day to find him and when found, he had worn his boots off and had a story to tell about an encounter with a bear, but being made of sterner stuff he was none the worse for wear and tear, which was more than could be said of his machine. The first riders started coming into the finish line about 2:28 p.m. when Don Shacker, who was due in at 2:19 was the first through the line, some seven or more hours after the start. Some were discouraged with their times and a few were surprised. Many more were disqualified for being too late. Again, many riders began comparing notes and talking shop over a hot cup of coffee while others struggled in, some, well after dark. It was a warm and friendly group in the Willows that evening before everyone said their good-bys.

The end of another successful "cowbell" was had and during the next week, the results were computed and saved for the big dance being thrown two weeks later by the Oakland MC, which turned out a tremendous crowd to award the tro-

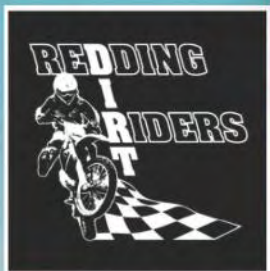

## Have A Rule You Think Needs To Be Added Or Changed?

The District 36 Operations Manual is a rulebook covering District 36 Procedures and Competition. Procedural rules are decided on by the District 36 Board of Directors and rules governing Competition are decided on by the District 36 Active Members (Clubs and Promoters).

Do you, as a current member of District 36, have a rule proposal you want to get submitted? If so you will need to fill out a Rule Proposal Form and submit it to the appropriate steward.....CC rules to the CC Steward; Jeremy Carlin, Enduro Rules to the Enduro Steward; Bruce Hendrickson, and Dirt Track Rules to the Dirt Track Steward; Mike Fowler. If your proposal is not discipline specific or applies to all disciplines you will submit your proposal to the Rules Chairman, [Bill McGibbon](#) and the Director of Competition, [Brian Garrahan](#).

We have rules for Rule Proposals and it's recommended

Rules submitted and approved take effect the following year

that if you're submitting a proposal you review the current [District 36 Operations Manual](#), section 1.6 Rulebook

The Rule Proposal form is editable (Download it first then you can fill it out on your computer and “save as”) or print them and fill them out by hand. To submit your proposal:

- Submitter must be a current District 36 Member.
- Fill out a [Rule Proposal / Change Form](#) completely.
- Submit the proposal by one of the following :
  - ◇ Send the proposal electronically to the appropriate person. You will find a list of steward contacts on our [District 36 Contact Page](#).
  - ◇ Hand it to a Steward at a meet.
  - ◇ Hand it in at a monthly D36 Meeting
  - ◇ Mail it to District 36 (see contact page)

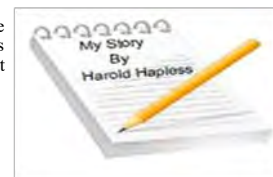
