The roar of the engine, the wind whipping through your hair, and the feeling of dirt spraying up from your tires – that's freedom. It's the feeling you chase every time you hit the trails, and it's a feeling you never forget. It's even better when share with such an incredible group of women.

Back in December 2020, something special was created: Women Off-Road Riders. With no other women's dirt bike clubs in the area, we knew that this would be a club other women would want to be part of. This club offers a welcoming space for women of all skill levels to share their passion for adventure.

What started with a handful of women has blossomed into a community of over 50 strong riders.

your opportunity.



Where Is My District 36 Membership Card?

From the date you apply for or renew your D36 membership, if your card does not get back to you by the 30 day mark, please contact: d36memberships@gmail.com.

Always read all of the instructions and fill out the application completely, so that your application can get processed timely. Always save your receipt. Always allow enough mailing/processing time to get the card back before you need it.

If Applications are: too sloppy to read; missing a full mailing address; missing your contact phone number and email address; missing the correct signature; or, if they have not yet been given to D36 from the clubs there may be a delay in receiving your membership card.

Pit Crews — The Unsung Heroes of Off-Road Motorcycle Racing!

Rarely we think of pit crews when we go racing, or at least we don't think of their importance to the rider's success. Pit crews in amateur off road usually consist of wives/husbands or girlfriends/boyfriends of the racer. Others can be a few family members, a few friends and/or relatives that come along to a race to 'help out'. Pit crews are truly the unsung heroes as the racer gets the glory and accolades after a great race. But the racer knows they are the reason for his/her success because without them more time would be spent during a pit stop and this leads to lost time on the course.

The fast riders that do well do so because when they have to pit for gas they get a short rest, while the pit crew gets them some water, clean goggles, maybe a face wipe, and fills the gas tank. Without this the rider would be getting off the bike, to do all or part of the above during a pit stop as well having no time to take a short rest. That rider with no pit crew falls behind the others that have pit crews taking care of them, lost time that is hard to make up.

A good pit crew is one where each crew member is in sync with the others in the crew, knows his or her specific task(s) and stays out of the way of other as they perform their duties. Typically, a good crew consist of three people, one to remove the gas cap and assist in getting the gas in the tank and replacing the gas cap; one to handle the gas can; one to hand the riders a fresh set of goggles, gloves and assist in changing these as well as cleaning the riders face of sweat / dirt if needed. While three is ideal, a fourth person on the crew stays out of the way while looking over the bike and handling a rider's request for something that may be needed. A larger crew, say five or more, tends to create problems as they start to get in each other's way and this may lead to minor chaos. Also, larger pit crews take up more area in the pits that, if the pits are in a small area, leads to even more chaos.

One of the greatest things about most pit crews in amateur racing is the wiliness to jump in an assist another crew that may be having problems, even if that crew is for a rider their own rider is in fierce competition with.

Race promoters, under the rules of the America Motorcyclist Association as well as local AMA Districts that oversee sanctions, restrict the crews to not bring small children, pets or alcohol into the pits. Restrictions that are for the safety of the riders and respective pit crews.

At the end of the day, it's the racer that takes that victory lap and stands up on the podium for the photo shoot and gets all the credit while the ones that pitted him or her stand in the background. Therefore, this is to acknowledge and say THANK YOU to any and all that have or will serve as part of a pit crew. Your time and effort while ignored by all, except of course your racer, is very important to the success of your racer taking that victory lap and standing proud on the podium! •

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D36 Enduro Steward's Report

The 2024 District 36 Enduro season started with the Redding Dirt Riders (RDR) hosting a two day event run in conjunction with the AMA ISDE West Qualifier. RDR did a fantastic job hosting the event that featured more than 50 riders competing for a place on the Team USA going to Spain this year to defend last year's dominating team performance. With more than 500 entries for the three day event (Day 3 was ISDE only) this was the largest enduro event of the millennium for the district. While the ISDE teams have not been announced D36 riders JT Baker and Lane Lorenzo finished the top seven and should be

invited to the team. Northern California rider Ava Silvestri topped the Women's ISDE riders and should be a lock to make the first ever Women's ISDE club team. See the article on the next page for more on the event.

The Wildhorse was round 5 this year after the two round start and it was the desert selection of snow rain and sun at the end of the day. Austin Serpa, Joey Fiasconaro, JT Baker beat the challenging conditions to finish top 3 for the day.

The meat of the spring season is just getting started with nine rounds still remaining for the expanded 12 round season. Next up is the Sawmill and Crosscut, first time back since 2018 and featuring the first Sprint format enduro run at Middle Creek. Later in April is another two round event at Wilseyville featuring an expanded course for this year's second edition of the event. May finishes out with the Fools Gold and 49er enduros.◆

ISDE West Qualifier Unfolds in Redding

Just outside of Redding, California, and at the base of the Shasta Dam lies the Chappie-Shasta OHV area, where racers from as far away as Pennsylvania lined up February 24-26 to compete for their chance to represent the United States at the ISDE in Spain this fall.

This picturesque setting is the home base for the Redding Dirt Riders, the host to the ISDE West Qualifier.

The ISDE West Qualifier is a three-day event, with the first two days running alongside AMA District 36 Enduro Races, That Dam Enduro, rounds one and two. Having these two sprint enduros running at the same time as the Qualifier meant that the Redding Dirt Riders had their work cut out for them.

"To one day know that the youth of this community could be out here [racing] some of the best riders in the world is incredible," said Jonathon Estes, a longtime member and course marshal.

That encouragement of young riders is evidenced by the many riders of high accolade who grow up attending district races before forging their racing careers. This includes Dante Oliveira and Mateo Oliveira, who were in

attendance this weekend. They were joined by more than 50 individuals competing in the LOI (Letter of Intent) classes, including many who also competed in the LOI Pro class. This was further punctuated by 10 women competing in the LOI Women's class. This is the first LOI Pro Women's class for an ISDE Qualifier to offer a purse. This was in large part due to a donation from Carlos Cheeseman, which made it possible for the Redding Dirt Riders to match the payout and offer compensation to help these racers on their quest to race in Spain. In fact, throughout all the classes this weekend, almost \$6000 will be paid out.

The race featured almost 200 miles of trail consisting of two loops: a shorter-mileage East Loop and a longer-mileage West Loop. Together, racers would complete both loops twice, totaling almost 60 miles of fast, technical racing each day.

Conditions on the first two days of racing were what racers dream about. Heavy rain in the weeks prior to the race weekend made the ground just wet enough to provide good traction and keep dust to a minimum. Coupled with bluebird sunny skies and daytime temperatures in the high 60s, it set the stage for fast racing.

Racing kicked off at a fiery pace on Saturday. Dante Oliveira (KTM), who is already a lock for the U.S. Trophy Team, as is his brother Mateo, took the top Pro spot, followed by Mateo Oliveira and the top LOI rider Layton Smail (1:53:12).

On Sunday, the Oliveira brothers battled it out again, but this time traded positions, with Mateo (1:42:41) coming out on top over his brother, Dante (1:42:44). Smail (1:44:46) maintained his position in third overall. All riders pushed their paces to each improve their times by nine-plus minutes.

Ava Silvestri (Gas-Gas) took the top spot for LOI Women's both days, improving her time by over 10 minutes.

Day three, which took place on Monday, February 26, was for the LOI riders

only. The Oliveira brothers did not compete on the day, as they were technically competing in the Pro class.

On Monday, Smail topped the charts (all LOI riders) on his Sherco and was the overall winner of the LOIs. Smail edged out Jaden Dahners (KTM) by more than two minutes, while Beta's Zane Roberts was third overall, another few minutes in back.

Tyler Vore (GasGas) and JT Baker (KTM) rounded out the top five overall.

Smail's dad, Lance, competed in the LOI Senior division and was fourth in class, behind Senior winner Eric Forsberg, Eric Stevenson and Ryan Kudla.

The top LOI female racer was



Silvestri in 27th overall.

Sherman Lee #7E-2024 Hot Shoe Hall of Fame Inductee

This past January, in Las Vegas, Nevada, Sherman Lee was inducted into the Hot Shoe Hall of Fame. Gene Woods, a three time U.S. Open Speedway Champion during the 1980's, is the founder. He began this annual tradition as a way to remember and honor motorcycle riders and industry icons past and present. Hot Shoe Hall of Fame is also a charity which provides "Heart Shoes" to needy men, women, and children in the Las Vegas area. Along with Sherman and many others, Mert Lawwill was honored with a lifetime achievement award for his outstanding contributions to the motorcycle industry. One contribution is his development of Mert's Hands, a device for adaptive riders. Sherman uses such a device in order to compete and is the first rider to have the AMA #1 plate for Adaptive Riders in 2021.



California State Parks Encourages Off-Highway Vehicle Enthusiasts to Share the Trail During OHV Spring Safety Week, March 23 to 31

SACRAMENTO, Calif. – California State Parks Off-Highway Motor Vehicle Recreation (OHMVR) Division and its partners are encouraging off-highway vehicle (OHV) enthusiasts to "Share the Trails," the theme for the upcoming Spring OHV Safety Week, taking place from March 23 to 31. This semiannual event promotes safe and responsible OHV recreation across California's dedicated OHV public lands. This year's theme reminds OHV recreational users to focus on sharing the responsibility of following safety protocols and protecting the state's natural resources.

"It's important that everyone in the OHV community understands that they share the responsibility for safety," said OHMVR Division Chief Callan McLaughlin. "We share our trails with many types of off-road vehicles and people of different skill levels, so everyone has the opportunity to enjoy our public lands."

The Spring OHV Safety Week provides an excellent opportunity for all riders, both experienced and newcomers, to enhance their knowledge, skills, and awareness of safe OHV practices by taking safety courses and following simple rules. Training teaches everyone to "Share the Trails" by:

- Staying to the right: Practice proper trail etiquette by always staying to the right side of any trail.
- **Show Yourself**: Use a whip and flag at least 8 feet from the ground and wear high-visibility clothing.
- **Share your Skills**: Take a <u>FREE safety class</u>, which can help you become a more experienced rider, then share what you've learned with others.

During this year's OHV Safety Week, several state vehicular recreation areas (SVRAs) will host free safety training classes for OHV riders. For those interested in participating in these free classes, schedules and sign-up information is available on the California Outdoor Recreation Foundation website: OutdoorRecreationFoundation.org.

In October 2020, the <u>California OHMVR Commission</u> passed a resolution dedicating two weeks of the year to promote and focus on safe and responsible OHV practices.

Working together with the <u>Tread Lightly! Initiative</u>, <u>California Highway Patrol</u>, <u>California Outdoor Recreation Foundation</u>, <u>Specialty Vehicle Institute of America</u>, <u>ATV Safety Institute</u> (ASI), <u>Recreational Off-Highway Vehicle Association</u> (ROHVA), <u>Motorcycle Industry Council</u>, <u>Motorcycle Safety Foundation</u> (MSF), and <u>Bureau of Land Management</u>, the OHMVR Division has been providing a mix of safety messages and activities during the OHV safety awareness weeks, using park interpretive programs, in-person events, and safety messaging via various social media platforms. Additionally, ASI, ROHVA, and MSF have teamed up with the division to provide free dirt bike, all-terrain vehicle, and recreational OHV training.

California's OHMVR Program was created in 1971 out of the critical need to better manage the growing demands for OHV recreation, while fostering respect for private property rights and protecting the state's natural and cultural resources. Today, there are nine SVRAs across California: Carnegie SVRA, Clay Pit SVRA, Eastern Kern County Onyx Ranch SVRA, Heber Dunes SVRA, Hollister Hills SVRA, Hungry Valley SVRA, Oceano Dunes SVRA, Ocotillo Wells SVRA, and Prairie City SVRA. These public lands provide recreational opportunities on approximately 145,000 acres of lands with more than 600 miles of designated OHV trails and terrain. Some SVRAs also feature camping, swimming, and other recreational opportunities. A variety of wildlife, sensitive habitats, plants, and animal species call them home.

The OHMVR program also supports safe and responsible OHV recreation beyond the State Park System. Since 1971, more than \$803 million in grants, managed by the OHMVR Division, have been awarded to federal and local partners, funding acquisition and development, resource protection, safety and education, and law enforcement for OHV recreation.

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
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JOHNSON VALLEY - RATIONALE FOR STRONG OHV ADVOCACY

OHV recreation in California is replete with seminal moments that have impacted motorized access to public lands for better or worse. Such key events include creation of the CA Off-Highway Motor Vehicle Recreation (OHMVR) Program in 1971, passage of the 1994 CA Desert Protection Act, the complete overhaul of the CA OHV program via passage of SB 742 by the legislature in 2007, closure of the BLM's Clear Creek OHV Area in 2009, and passage of the National Defense Authorization Act in 2014 that created the Johnson Valley Shared Use Area.

On a recent visit to the Johnson Valley OHV Area as part of a CA OHMVR Commission Tour of the King of the Hammers off-road racing event, I was again impressed by the strong partnership that exists between the Marine Corps, BLM, State Parks, local law enforcement, OHV community, racing promoters, powersports industry, and local businesses.

Over 15 years ago, many OHV grassroots groups got their memberships and elected officials engaged (circa 2008 – 2012) in the early planning

process for the Combat expansion proposal that threatened to permanently close all or part of the Johnson Valley OHV Area to the public. Besides asking our members to send letters, a strong coalition of OHV recreation groups sent in the following position statement to the Marine planning team as listed below.

For those who ask why they should be involved in, or support, government relations, volunteerism, and building partnerships, I believe this issue provides the rationale for that engagement.

The thousands of comment letters sent in by the OHV community to the planning process and elected officials combined with the hard work by your OHV advocacy corps back in the day is why millions of motorized recreation enthusiasts continue to enjoy use of public lands at Johnson Valley and elsewhere in CA and the West. And, is why their presence – and member participation/support - continues to help preserve and protect access to sustainable OHV recreation for current and future generations.

AMA D37 Dual Sport Club Attends March 2008 Scoping Meeting

California OHV Recreation Stakeholder Group October 2008 Position Statement on Johnson Valley Issue

We the undersigned strongly oppose the withdrawal of the Bureau of Land Management, Johnson Valley Off-Highway Vehicle (OHV) Recreation Area by the Marine Corps Air Ground Combat Center, Twenty-nine Palms.



District 36 Membership Information Did you know?



- D36 memberships expire on the last day of the month/ year that is noted on the card, not the first day of that month. (Noted in the small print on the card or renewal notice.)
- Membership expiration dates don't get set by the exact day of the month you bought the membership. (See D36 rule 2.3)
- If you renew your membership timely, the expiration date extends one full year.
- If you wait longer than one month after the expiration date to renew, the expiration date will adjust according to rule 2.3.
- When a membership remains "expired" longer than one full year, there is no guarantee that the same membership number can be reassigned when it does get renewed. (See D36 rule 2.3)
- Membership numbers that have been in "expired" status longer than one year are subject to 'release' and they become available for new members, or for any member who has submitted a membership number change request.
- D36 Cross Country racing rule 7.6.10 specifies that all unranked A and AA class riders will use their D36 mem-

- bership number as their bike (racing) number. It also specifies that all three number plates on the bike will display the rank number or the D36 membership number. (Please do not badger the scoring team to get them to program your transponder to any different number and please don't run other numbers on your plates.)
- D36 membership applications that are not signed with the valid/legal signature cannot be processed until the correct signature has been acquired. (Everyone 18+ years old must sign their own application. 18+ year olds are no longer eligible to be included on a family membership, even if they still live at home.)
- Receipts for memberships are only valid for 40 days.
 (D36 rule 2.8) If you do not receive your card within 30 days from the date you purchased the membership, please contact d36memberships@att.net.



If so you will need to fill out a Rule Proposal Form and submit it to the appropriate steward.....CC rules to the CC Steward; Jeremy Carlin, Enduro Rules to the Enduro Steward; Bruce Hendrickson, and Dirt Track Rules to the Dirt Track Steward; Mike Fowler. If your proposal is not discipline specific or applies to all disciplines you will submit your proposal to the Rules Chairman, Bill McGibbon and the Director of Competition, Brian Garrahan.

We have rules for Rule Proposals and it's recommended

that if you're submitting a proposal you review the current <u>District 36 Operations Manual</u>, section 1.6 Rulebook

The Rule Proposal form is editable (Download it first then you can fill it out on your computer and "save as") or print them and fill them out by hand. To submit your proposal:

- Submitter must be a current District 36 Member.
- Fill out a Rule Proposal / Change Form completely.
