2025 AMA ISDE West Qualifier Results

Layton Smail came on strong at the end to win the Wilseyville ISDE Qualifier.

Just outside Wilseyville, California, at the historic Camp Lodestar, nearly 30 ISDE hopefuls

lined up for the AMA West ISDE Qualifier, battling not just each other but the brutal conditions left behind by weeks of excessive rain. In total, more than 200 riders showed up for the weekend, taking on the annual sprint enduro that was

held in conjunction with the qualifier this year. But for those vying for a spot on the U.S. ISDE team heading to Italy, the stakes were far

higher than just a podium finish.

After two difficult and challenging days on the trail, Team Green's Layton Smail edged out FMF/RPM/KTM's Jaden Dahners by 31 seconds to take the overall victory.

The sons of top off-road racers, Lance Smail and Jason Dahners, went back and forth all weekend in the race's 15 special tests. They each topped five tests, but Smail was slightly more consistent than Dahners throughout the weekend. Smail picked up the pace when he needed to late Sunday afternoon to claim the overall victory.

ON BEING A MEMBER OF A LONG-STANDING MOTORCYCLE CLUB

After the finish of an Enduro, like the 52-year-old Jackhammer or the 2-year-old Li'l Hammer, by the 117-year-old Oakland Motorcycle Club, the riders really feel like they accomplished something. They all come



back to the finish area, collect their cold drink, wait around for the results to be posted and generally like to talk to other riders or we, the promoting club members. Their minds are clear and there's always lots of talk about certain sections, features, speed averages, or perhaps a fall or mistake one might have



made. Myself, as the Off-Road Chairman, of the O.M.C., my duty as Referee, was to see if there were any protests, complaints or otherwise and secondarily, to congratulate the riders as they come in. O.M.C.'s icon, the 52-year-old steel Jackhammer, welded to a 1/2' thick steel plate, was there at the finish, and I was trying to get the racers to get a photo of them with or without their award plaque near or on that teeth-chattering air tool. Stonyford OHV, in No. CA, is a pretty hard scrabble area to run an enduro, with rocky, loose rutted uphills, gnarly, steep downhills, lots of tight single track, creek crossings, dust, tree roots - large and small - hard manzanita bushes, doug' firs and pine trees all over, etc., etc. Indeed, a fitting name;

Third overall, Lane Lorenzo, on the 707 Suspension/Mojo Motorsports/Level 1 GasGas, stuck his front wheel in the mix. He started off fast, winning three tests and finishing just a little more than a minute off the pace when all was said and done.

KTM rider Anson Maloney also got in on the mix, winning a test on Saturday and going on to finish fourth overall. Beta's Max Gerston was right there, as well, putting his Max Off-Road Beta into the top five at the end. Ryder Thomaselli (Husqvarna), Zane Roberts (Beta), Nolan Cate (Honda), Anthony Ferrante (KTM) and Zachary Kerling (GasGas) rounded out the top 10 overall.



Lane Lorenzo started hot and finished out the weekend third overall.



Ava Silvestri dominated the Women's division, winning all 15 tests.

GasGas rider Ava Silvestri dominated the Women's LOI class by winning all 15 tests.

Kawasaki-mounted Ashlee Gage was Silvestri's closest rival. She finished 15 minutes back but just a few minutes ahead of third-place finisher Rachel Stout on the RPM KTM. Charle Nute (KTM) and Addy Albrecht (KTM) completed the top five overall.

"It was tough, but that's what makes this event so important," Silvestri said. "It forces you to adapt—because ISDE won't wait for perfect conditions."

The International Six Days Enduro (ISDE) is the pinnacle of off-road racing—a grueling test of speed, endurance and mental toughness. Riders must not only navigate six consecutive days of intense competition but also maintain their own bikes without outside assistance. Italy's terrain promises to be a punishing mix of technical rocky climbs, deep ruts and high-speed

tests, demanding a level of preparation few races can provide. That's why this year's West Qualifier was so telling: the slick, muddy course in Wilseyville mirrored the kind of unpredictable conditions racers will face abroad.

Wilseyville has long been considered a proving ground for some of the toughest riders, and this year's conditions only reinforced that reputation. Race officials and the NorCal Motorcycle Club faced their own set of challenges, scrambling to adjust the course after heavy rain and snow left large sections waterlogged and slower than they would have liked for the ISDE Qualifier. The chilly temperatures only added another layer of difficulty, creating unpredictable traction that demanded peak concentration from competitors. But adversity breeds champions, and for those with ISDE dreams, overcoming these obstacles was just another part of proving they belong on the world stage.

Despite being a relatively small club, the NorCal Motorcycle Club has built a reputation for hosting national events, thanks to its deep ties within the off-road racing community. Their dedicated network of volunteers and partner organizations played a crucial role in ensuring the race could go on despite the weather challenges. Among them, the Women Off-Road Riders stood out, providing key logistical support and course assistance to keep the event running smoothly. This collective commitment to the sport has made Wilseyville not just a qualifier, but a proving ground for riders aspiring to compete at the highest level.

"The course was diverse and challenging," said Anson Maloney. "It wasn't just about who was the fastest—it was about who could keep their head in it all weekend long."

"ISDE isn't just about speed," said AMA Off-Road Racing Manager Michael Jolly. "It's about mental stamina. That's what we saw tested this weekend, and the riders who made it through cleanly are showing they're ready for the challenge ahead."

The challenges in Wilseyville serve as a fitting preview of what awaits in Bergamo, Italy. The Valli Bergamasche region has a storied history in enduro racing, first hosting the ISDE in 1968. Its terrain varies from high mountains and steep, rocky sections to long, fast cross tests, offering one of the most complete tests of enduro skill anywhere in the world. With over 600 riders from more than 30 nations expected to compete, the U.S. qualifiers will face a true international battlefield. ◆

To put on an enduro like this, takes literally a cast of 40 or more people. Our course set up guys spent weekend after weekend out at the Stonyford Off Highway Park, riding the course, measuring with their ODO's and entering mileages in small note books, taking pic's of specific areas that will be speed test checks, parts of trails that will need more work, or re-routing and clearing trails (with chain -saws attached to their bikes) hanging ribbons - to identify routes - and this takes numerous weekends to build a 100 mile A/B/C course. On the week before the event, usually around Tuesday or Wednesday, we O.M.C.'ers start showing up in our RV's, camp trailers, vans and trucks to help the helpers. Final course markings





(arrows, dots, "W"rong way posts, high skill areas, danger arrows) all go up these few days. Pre-assigned duties in weeks of previous O.M.C. meetings are carried out (who brings the bikes, food, the drinks, the tools, time clocks, flags, arrows, ribbon, canopies, start / finish sign-up trailer, etc., etc., etc.)

The race goes off Sunday morning at 7:30 A.M. and as I said above, the riders come back in about 6 - 8 hours happy, clear headed and are so eager to tell their story, good or bad. When I used to ride enduros, back mostly in the 80's, yes, I felt the same way. My head was so uncluttered; no work worries, no home thoughts or concerns, just so glad to have endured a long, tough enduro, glad I didn't get hurt and just wanting a cold beer. It's a

great feeling, let me tell ya.

Which brings me to "why" I joined the Oakland M/C Club. Well down into the early 80's, I would ride this Enduro a few times, their Sheetiron Dual Sport ride a couple of times from '00 on, and see many of these same friendly faces time and again. I'd think to myself - at least when I lived in Oakland - "gee, I live 10 minutes from their club hall, maybe I should see what this 'club thing' is all about." So I go to a couple of their Wednesday night meetings, am blown away by the m/c history in their club hall, have fun, socialize with a bunch of like-minded folks, drink, laugh a bunch and I come back with an overwhelming sense that; "these are some really great individuals" that for the most part, are just giving back to the sport that gave them so much. I quickly made the



decision that yes, I can also ride with my long-time friends in an "anti-club," *taking* fun from the motor-cycle world, but I can *give some back* by being an O.M.C. member and helping put on events that give riders so much satisfaction and deep-seated fun. For the last three + years I now live two hours away, but I stay very active with this club, because of the people, the relationships I have developed that I don't want to give up.





AMA District 36 Stands Up for OHV Access in Northwest Forest Plan Update

AMA District 36 has spoken up for off-highway vehicle (OHV) riders in a big way! We recently submitted official comments on the proposed Northwest Forest Plan (NWFP) Amendment, calling out the fact that recreation and the transportation system were left out of the draft environmental review.

We're asking the Forest Service to go back and take another look—because leaving out OHV access and trail networks could have major consequences for riders, rural economies, and even wildfire management.

OHV Riding Boosts Local Economies

Recreation is a massive economic driver in the Northwest Forest Plan region, bringing in:

- \$73.8 billion in California
- \$7.5 billion in Oregon
- \$20 billion in Washington

OHV events and tourism are a huge part of that. Many AMA District 36 rides take place in small, rural communities that rely on recreation dollars to stay afloat—especially after wildfires. OHV riders bring business back when these areas need it most.

OHV Trails Are More Than Just Fun—They're Critical Infrastructure

Our letter also pointed out something that often gets overlooked: OHV trails and roads aren't just for riding-they're essential for emergency response.

When wildfires hit, trails are used for:

✓ Firefighting access

Search and rescue operations

✓ Evacuations and disaster response

Groups like the Post Wildfire OHV Recovery Alliance (PWORA) are often first on the scene after a fire, clearing trails and reopening access before the general public is even allowed back in. Their work supports local businesses and speeds up recovery, yet they weren't even mentioned in the draft plan.

We Can't Let History Repeat Itself

The 1994 NWFP led to tons of OHV road and trail closures, often without proper input from the people who use them. We don't want to see the same thing happen again.

That's why we're pushing for the Forest Service to:

- ✓ Protect OHV trail systems and improve connectivity
- √ Recognize OHV routes as valuable for recreation AND emergency response
- ✓ Involve the public before shutting down any more roads and trails


What's Next?

We're asking the Forest Service to take the next step and prepare a Supplemental Environmental Impact Statement (SEIS)—basically, a do-over that actually considers recreation and transportation.

This fight isn't over, and AMA District 36 will keep working to make sure OHV riders have a seat at the table. Stay tuned for updates, and if you haven't already, get involved! Your voice matters when it comes to keeping our trails open. •

AMA Insurance Program Changes

ATTENTION: Youth / Family Enduro Promoters and Riders

I am sure everyone reading this has been impacted by recent insurance changes and price increases. There was a real possibility this year that AMA provided insurance program would not be available which would have certainly impacted District 36 events. Luckily they were able to negotiate a new contract without large increases.

One change that was poorly communicated by the AMA was the change with the Youth / Family events moving from recreational insurance back into the competition insurance program. The impact of this is all participants in these events are now required to have AMA membership to meet the insurance requirements. See the excerpt below from the AMA Motorcyclist March magazine and read the complete article for more information.

"Insurers have the reasonable expectation to know whose activities they are insuring. They also consider AMA membership a personal commitment to the sport. This is why membership is required for all races and nationallevel recreational events. (The importance of membership is also why insurance providers have recently strongly scrutinized AMA recreational events that don't require membership. Not surprisingly, rates for those events have increased more on a percentage basis, and to some degree the effect has spilled over to other event types.) The last year has reminded us that affordable, quality insurance is a privilege, not a right. We must work to keep it available." -

Tickets, bands and camping passes are separate for each weekend event. Warren Minster is the Inside Track Director and will be working with you all as well as the series Flagger Coordinator. For Volunteers I will get all the meeting information out to you at a later date when it is all finalized. As always, we will have the 'Wheels On The Ground' crew as well. If you are any of the other crews, please reach out to the person listed on the form(s) for permission.



Minor & Adult Release Of Liability To Race

All District 36 Meets / Events are sanctioned through he American Motorcyclist Association, aka: AMA and as such all participants must sign a release form at each meet or have an AMA Annual Release for adults and an Annual Minor Release for each youth on file with the AMA. These Annual Releases are acquired by signing up on the AMA website (link below)

From the AMA:

All youth participants at events must have an annual minor release form on file with the AMA OR have both parents or sole custody adult in attendance to participate.

If parent/legal guardian is not in attendance, the youth participant must have an annual release on file and the representative of the parents must have a guardianship signed by both parents and notarized.

If you don't get an adult Annual Release, at each race there is an adult release form with lines for multiple signatures. For youth, as stated by the AMA, both parents or a legal Sole Custody Adult must be present at the race. If both parents can't attend, a youth release form signed and notarized is require. This form can be downloaded for signatures and notarized to bring to the meet.



It's strongly recommended to sign up for the AMA Annual Release and a card that must be presented at each competition meet will be sent to you. In some cases a club/promoter may still require each entrant to sign the release forms at the meet and having a Youth Annual Release card means you won't have to have a notarized youth release form with you. Note that all Annual Releases are valid for the the calendar year acquired and must be renewed each year.

Racing With Your kids?

Minor Release Requirements Your Responsibility as Parents

If you have a minor that is competing in any form of competition in District 36 or in other states in any type of Competition that is sanctioned by the American Motorcyclist Association (AMA) or Districts, a 'Minor Release" must be submitted to the club / promotor.

This Minor release is a form that must be signed by <u>both parents</u> of the minor (any one under the age of 18) and submitted to the promoting organization prior to the competition. If the Parent has sole custody then only that parent is required to sign a release. These paper forms are available as all District 36 competition meets.

With joint custody, failure of both parents to sign a Minor Release at a motorcycle competition event can have legal consequences for the parents. Therefor it's imperative that with joint custody both parents sign a minor release form.

In cases where both parents can't attend an event there are two ways to meet the requirement of both signatures. One is to get a release form from the American Motorcyclist association website (https://americanmotorcyclist.com/wp-content/uploads/2024/02/2020-Minor-Release.pdf), fill it out, sign it and get it notarized prior to attend the event, orSign an AMA Annual Minor Release form electronically. There are two versions of this electronic form; one for joint custody and one for sole custody. This stays on file with the AMA and you receive a card that is presented at the event your entering, proving the release. This release is valid for the calendar year it's signed and must be renewed each year.
