D36 Enduro Steward's Report



The long hot summer is finally behind us and it is time to get back to riding. Unfortunately the Mosquito fire has knocked out the Crazy Miner for this year but the good news is the area was not damaged so look for its return in the spring on the same weekend as the Fools Gold in 2023.

Speaking of next year, look for good things with an expanded schedule of Enduros. An old venue is returning and a new venue for Enduros is joining the schedule. The Sawmill and Crosscut will be moving to Middle Creek next year and plans are already in progress for it. The Cowbell fell victim again this year to the shortage of Forest Service personnel but they expect that to be rectified for next year. Watch for the 2023 D36 event schedule to be published in the coming months for details.

Pre-entry is already open for the Coyote Creek and Jackhammer, the first two of the three Adult Championship Enduros that remain in the fall. The Steam Donkey per-entry will probably open up in mid October so check back later on the District 36 Website Enduro page, Others may be up by the time this is published. The Pre-entry is also open for the Coyote Creek Family Enduro, the first of two Family Enduros this fall. The Pre-entry for the last Family Enduro, the Bearfoot should open mid-October or sooner.

For all competition meets please consider using pre-entry, If you haven't used it you will find it's

quick, easy, done from the comfort of your home or office, usually saves you money, and it helps the clubs speed sign ups so you're not waiting in long lines. And another feature of entering online is that If for some reason you cannot make the event, refunds can be done quickly online.

Also make note that all fall adult championship Enduros will feature same day trophy distribution so make sure you stop by and check the live results scoreboard before you leave for the day to see if you have a trophy to pick up. Most class trophies will be awarded as soon as all scorecards are in for that class so you do not have to wait for the last rider in. As always please turn in your scorecard, if you choose to quit early or decide to not do a second or third loop for the day, the clubs still need to have them to know you're back and not have to go looking for you in a bush somewhere.



Don Amador District 36 LAO Activities

Sept. 10, 2022

HISTORIC ACCOMPLISHMENT FOR THE D36 LAO PROGRAM – Our legislation, SB 894, passed out of the legislature on Wednesday with HUGE bipartisan support. The bill was approved by a vote of 71-2 in the Assembly and 40-0 in the Senate. Now it is off the Governor Newsom's office where we await his support. The Governor has until September 30 to act on this bill.

HERE IS WHAT THE BILL WILL DO:

- SB 894 will create an OHV Competition Sticker registration program for models 2022 and newer to r place the terminated Red Sticker registration pr gram by restoring the registration requirement for all OHVs when operated in competition events on public lands. SB 894 also requires competition OHVs to have a spark arrester as a wildfire prevention measure and a sound compliant muffler to address concerns about competition OHVs' noise pollution when operated at sanctioned competition events held at areas managed by local, state, and federal agencies.
- SB 894 also ensures that law enforcement officers will be able to identify a competition vehicle and its owner via an easy to read "Competition Decal" and DMV registration. This registration will allow law enforcement to track, trace, and cite riders who illegally use competition OHVs such as those that are trespassing or are stolen.
- SB 894 and its proposed registration fee will reinstate monies historically slated for important conservation and law enforcement efforts that were lost with the termination of the Red Sticker program.

The D36 LAO Program wants to give big thanks to Senator Jones (a true legislative champion for our sport) and his staff, our industry partners such as the Motorcycle Industry Council, Motorcycle Dealers Association, KTM/ Husky, Kawasaki, and Beta. Also thanks to the many offroad clubs, individual dealers, and conservation groups who supported this bill.

STATUS OF OHV TRUST FUND - the LAO Program remains concerned about the fiscal health of the OHV Trust Fund. The following concerns remain.

Over the last 10-15 years, the D36 LAO has communicated its concerns about the ongoing redirection of OHV TF monies from the OHMVR Program and that it has gone on for far too long

- Since 2011/12 when AB 95 went into effect over \$100 million in OHV related gas tax has been redirected to the General Fund and it continues today.
- The OHMVR Program is running an annual deficit of \$15-25 million and the balance in the OHV TF is being drained by this deficit spending

The LAO Program has meet with Parks several times over the summer regarding our budget and Trust Fund concerns and have made a commitment to give a full report – at the September OHV Commission Meeting next week - on the status of the OHV Trust Fund, the "Reserve" Fund, the annual budget, revenues coming in, OHV funds going to other departments and agencies for non-OHV activities, etc.

*LEGISLATIVE ACTION FOR NEXT YEAR - To ensure the fiscal health of the OHV Program, the LAO Program will be reviewing the potential for legislation next year that will halt the unnecessary redirection of \$10 million in annual OHV gas tax from the OHV Trust Fund.

EDUCATION OF NEW LEGISLATORS in 2023 - There will be an historic number of new legislators coming to Sacramento after the fall election. This massive sea change is due to a large number of current legislators being termed out. The LAO Program has asked the OHV Div sion to partner with us in a joint effort to educate (both in-person and in the field) new legislators and their staff about the OHV program and its many positive and pro active tenets including conservation, restoration, LE, and safety. Field trips for legislators/staff to local SVRAs such as Prairie City SVRA have proven highly effective in helping them understand and appreciate the value of our program.

REOPENING CLEAR CREEK - The LAO met with the BLM District Manager to get an update on the BLM's effort to reopen CC via administrative action that was discussed in our May 2022 meeting. The BLM stated they have hired a new Field Manager and will be announcing that soon. The LAO will meet with the BLM leads once that position goes public later this month or in early October.

REVIEWING SITES IN NORTH STATE FOR NEW SVRA - Since January 2022, the LAO has facilitated a field trips between CA State Parks and real estate professionals in the following counties, Butte, Glenn, Tehama, Shasta, and Si kiyou on to review potential sites for a new SVRA - or a hybrid state/fed riding area - that would host both permitted events and casual use. The initial property review has been submitted to the Parks Property Team for review.

ROGUE/ILLEGAL SXS USE AT OHV AREAS - The LAO attending a State Parks interagency SxS safety conference on August 23 at McClellan AFB to review - and seek solutions to - illegal and rogue activity by certain SxS groups and the growing number of accidents between dirt bikes and SxSs. This is one of the LAO's top priorities in 2022 and beyond.

UPDATE ON CLOSED/OPEN COURSE EVENTS AT SVRAs -

The OHV Division has created interim guidelines for local and federal law enforcement to adopt an "educational approach" to the 2022+ model year registration mess created when our competition bill did not pass last year using a recent guideline issued by State Parks. So far this has been working...

THE LAO WOULD LIKE THE DISTRICT TO CONSIDER NEW "TRAIL BIKE" CLASS - Several trends are emerging within our industry and I believe that the group consider the current and evolving conditions that affect our riders and our organization. We are all aware that costs of attending races have significantly increased and the current economic trends have the families spending more as the cost of living and inflation have increased.

The global supply chain disruptions for the vehicle manufacturers are limiting production capabilities and costs are increasing at the manufacturing and shipping levels.

The motorcycle manufacturers are under increasing pressure to produce (globally) more emission compliant vehicles. Pressures also exist related to the North American importation and sales of non-mission compliant vehicles, specifically motorcycles. In California we have experienced the regulatory pressures that are impacting pure racing vehicles and we have also experienced increased costs of the vehicles and limited supply.

It is probable that some California registration solution will be found, however in the long term it is suggested that a plan to accommodate the evolving emission compliant vehicles within the sporting regulations be consid-

From a technical standpoint, the motorcycles that are currently available are substantially different performance levels where the power and weight differences exclude many vehicles from being considered by riders for participation in the District 36 events.

It is understood that racing is intended for racing vehicles, however as the industry evolves, it is suggested that recognizing the more affordable to purchase and to maintain (and emission compliant) vehicles [including electric motorcycles] could help the District grow and maintain participants by encouraging the entry level "Trail Bike" riders to participate and to be scored separately.

This suggestion has the additional benefit related to safety for the youth and for riders who have not developed the skill, strength or desire to ride a full competition motorcycle.

The Trail Bike classes are a viable consideration and it is my opinion that this aspect could encourage more NEW people to compete in events.

As an example, at Glen Helen Gary Jones promotes Scrambles events. He started this to have a motorcycle racing opportunity for old bikes and riders to race and have fun. They added a pit bike class for bikes up to 230cc. This increased the entries by double and has brought many new people out to ride.

It is my hope that your committee will consider adding a Trail Bike class or classes to our competition events as appropriate.

STREAMLINING THE SVRA EVENT PERMITTING PROCESS

- The LAO continues its work with Parks to stress the Important of streamlining the competition event process and to make the process consistent throughout the SVRA system. The LAO is optimistic that Parks will accomplish this important task.

- Membership expiration dates don't get set by the exact day of the month you bought the membership. (See D36 rule 2.3)
- If you renew your membership timely, the expiration date extends one full year.
- If you wait longer than one month after the expiration date to renew, the expiration date will adjust according to rule 2.3.
- When a membership remains "expired" longer than one full year, there is no guarantee that the same membership number can be reassigned when it does get renewed. (See D36 rule 2.3)
- Membership numbers that have been in "expired" status longer than one year are subject to 'release' and they become available for new members, or for any member who has submitted a membership number change request.
- D36 Cross Country racing rule 7.6.10 specifies that all unranked A and AA class riders will use their D36 mem-



bership number as their bike (racing) number. It also specifies that all three number plates on the bike will display the rank number or the D36 membership number. (Please do not badger the scoring team to get them to program your transponder to any different number and please don't run other numbers on your plates.)

- D36 membership applications that are not signed with the valid/legal signature cannot be processed until the correct signature has been acquired. (Everyone 18+ years old must sign their own application. 18+ year olds are no longer eligible to be included on a family membership, even if they still live at home.)
- Receipts for memberships are only valid for 40 days.
 (D36 rule 2.8) If you do not receive your card within 30 days from the date you purchased the membership, please <u>Email Cat</u> (Membership Director)
- There is a lot of helpful membership related information on the D36 website – www.ama-d36.org. Go to the 'Resources' selection under the "Members" heading at the top of the home page. Also go to the 'Join' or 'Renew' selection and scroll down below the online application for additional information.

Membership Card Questions and Answers



District 36 Membership cards often cause a bit of confusion to new members . . . and often to those who have been a D36 member for a number of years, too!

The card size was created to be close to the size of a credit card - something that can easily fit into a wallet. With this size, we are limited to the amount of information that can be printed on the front sides of the cards.

When applications are processed, the cards are created in accordance to AMA and D36 rules.

Below are some explanations that might help answer some questions about your membership card.

- A. <u>Membership Type.</u> Only three membership types can be on a blue D36 membership card. The 'Sportsman' designation is for all members age 12 and older, "Mini Bike Rider" is for those ages 7/8-11 and Pee-Wee is for those up to age 7/8. (Veteran, Senior, Super Senior, Master, Pioneer, Woman, AA, Open, 200, 250, Vintage, Modified, Big Wheel, Clutchless, etc. are only racing classes they are not a membership type.)
- B. <u>Racing Classification</u>. The racing class shown on all membership cards is what one's Sportsman (adult) classification is/would be. This is set by D36's rules and by the Discipline Stewards.
- C. <u>Birth Date.</u> A full birth date must be given on the application. If a full birth date is not provided, either 1/1/2050 will appear on the card or, in the case that just an age (38 for example) was provided, then a guestimated month/date will be listed with the corresponding year to indicate the age of 38.
- D. <u>The Expiration Date.</u> A D36 membership expires on the last day of the month/year listed on the card. D36 memberships are valid one year from the <u>month</u> of purchase. (Example: If someone buys their first membership in the month of June, the expiration date will be the last day of the following May.)
- E. <u>District 36 Membership Number.</u> New members will be assigned the next available number when their application is processed. A membership number/letter cannot be assigned prior to an application being received and processed. All youth and all C class adults receive three numbers, plus letter, as their membership number. Membership numbers cannot begin with a zero. When a membership has remained expired for longer than one year, that membership number may be 'released' and then get reassigned to someone else. There is no guarantee that the same number will be reassigned to someone who renews an inactive membership that was expired for longer than one year.

Where Is My Membership Card?

From the date you apply for or renew your D36 membership, if your card does not get back to you by the 30 day mark, please contact d36memberships@gmail.com.

Always read all of the instructions and fill out the application completely, so that your application can get processed timely. Always save your receipt. Always allow enough mailing/processing time to get the card back before you need it.

If Applications are: too sloppy to read; missing a full mailing address; missing your contact phone number and email address; missing the correct signature; or, if they have not yet been given to D36 from the clubs there may be a delay in receiving your membership card.

If your proposal is not discipline specific or applies to all disciplines you will submit your proposal to the Rules Chairman, Bill McGibbon and the Director of Competition, Sean Rhodes.

We have rules for Rule Proposals and it's recommended

that if you're submitting a proposal you review the current District 36 Operations Manual, section 1.6 Rulebook

The Rule Proposal form is editable (Download it first then you can fill it out on your computer and "save as") or print them and fill them out by hand. To submit your proposal:

- Submitter must be a current District 36 Member.
- Fill out a Rule Proposal / Change Form completely.
- Submit the proposal by one of the following:
 - Send the proposal electronically to the appropriate person. You will find a list of steward contacts on our District 36 Contact Page.
 - ♦ Hand it to a Steward at a meet.
 - Hand it in at a monthly D36 Meeting
 - Mail it to District 36 (see contact page)
 - * Rule Submission Deadline—Oct 15
